

FROM THE DIRECTOR



Just for fun, I googled 'democracy under threat'. If you've wondered whether it is, or are convinced that it is, you're certainly not alone. It's a popular sentiment at the moment.

Yet this year we've had city council and state elections, and just now the most globally significant and closely-followed election perhaps ever. Early next year we'll vote federally. After sport, politics takes up the biggest share of news bandwidth. With so much democracy around us, our voices must be more influential than ever, right? Go Lions!

Populism thrives when a society's values become worn or fractured. There's often a widespread sense of



disenfranchisement, that 'nobody speaks for me'. Folks rally around a charismatic leader who tends to dodge policy and ethics in favour of a promise to stand up for ordinary people by force of their personality. It often relies on appeals to a golden era of prosperity and freedom, and leaders model themselves on legendary figures. It doesn't sound despotic, rule by what the 'ordinary people' want, but there's no clear line between that and tyranny of the majority. With a populist 'strong-man' at the helm, it's a short step from there to autocracy in the name of the people. Caesar seizes power, pun intended.

But nothing material ultimately withstands time. The fall of a tyrant leaves a vacuum. If a government organised around core values doesn't emerge quickly, the vacuum will be filled by the next strong-man. Pick your team.

Rule by values, however, faces its own challenges. Factionalism. Disagreements over small points of philosophy can become entrenched, and hobble any real change. Brutus tells us that duty and honour are the highest values, while Cassius values friendship and love. Both ultimately want the same thing, but slight differences between their moral values prevent them from being as effective as they can. Brutus weaponizes honour, Cassius weaponizes love. Can a fractured alliance of ethical partners stand up against the cult of personality? Is a broad alliance based on similar though not identical values even possible?

The belief that we currently live in a crisis of leadership has some sway. The battle of Philippi, which takes up the second half of Julius Caesar, is remembered historically for its poor leadership on both sides. Yet it ultimately signalled the end of the Roman Republic and ushered in autocracy.



Angus Thorburn

Angus is an actor and director in Brisbane, and this is his 5th year in the QSE Core Ensemble. His previous training and performances with QSE include the Apprenticeship and Henry IV Part 1 in 2019, Macbeth in the Dark in 2020, Romeo & Juliet in 2021, The Rover and Macbeth in 2022, and The Penelopiad in 2023 and Tartuffe earlier this year, which he was also Assistant Director for. Other than acting, Angus directed his own Shakespeare production of As You Like It in his parents' backyard. He participated in the La Boite

Assembly Program last year as a director, where he helped create a 10-minute performance about a friendship between a girl and her skog-bear.

He has most recently appeared as Dr Jekyll/Mr Hyde at
Sunnybank Theatre in 2024. Also, as Jacob Marley's Ghost in
Ebenezer, Darth Vader in Bard Wars, Charlie 'the Duck' in One
Man, Two Guvnors and Leonato in Much Ado About Nuthink at
Brisbane Arts Theatre in 2022-23. Some dramatic roles over the
years have included Leo Bailey in Mr Bailey's Minder
(Centenary Theatre Group 2020), Martin Dysart in Equus
(Brisbane Arts Theatre 2016) and Roo in Summer of the

Seventeenth Doll (Villanova Players 2015).

This is Dom's first production with the Queensland Shakespeare Ensemble.

(theatre of decay); and *Picasso's Women* (Chapel Off Chapel). Film / TV credits: *Harrow* Series 2 (Hoodlum Entertainment), *Bloody Hell* (Eclectik Vision), *Watch Me* (Scopofile Productions) and *Purge* (David King Media). She is currently an associate artist with the Queensland Shakespeare Ensemble, a performing member of Red Thread Stories Playback Theatre and a teacher at the Pullenvale Environmental Education Centre.

After completing the Apprenticeship and Advanced Apprenticeship Programs, Leah is excited to play with the Queensland Shakespeare Ensemble in 2024. In 2022, Leah graduated with a Bachelor of Arts/Secondary Education from the University of Queensland and completed her Honours program in 2023. She has recently been seen in *Tartuffe* (Queensland Shakespeare Ensemble), *The Penelopiad* (Queensland Shakespeare Ensemble), *Macbeth* (Queensland Shakespeare Ensemble), *As You Like It* (Thunderbear Productions for Anywhere Theatre Festival),

Judgement Day (Short + Sweet Festival) and The Bald Soprano (University of Queensland). As an artist, Leah is interested in the intersection between education and theatre, as well as making classical texts more accessible to young people.

A workshop facilitator and performance coach, her QSE Facilitating work includes: Shakespeare Prison Project, Young Actor's Shakespeare Intensive, Youth Justice Project, Theatre Games with QSE! and Raising Voices. Other Facilitating includes: University of Queensland, Access Arts, InsideOutside Theatre, and Sweet Adelines Australia (Regional Education Faculty).



Lillian Duggan

Lillian has over 20 years' experience as a professional actress. Prior to attending LAMDA, Lillian worked extensively in Ireland, appeared in many theatrical performances along with appearing on TV, Film and Radio including such TV shows such as FairCity and CrimeStoppers. She also produced and acted in many productions whilst running her own Theatre Company in Dublin (Driftwood). Lillian trained at LAMDA enjoying such roles as Varvara Mihailovna in Summerfolk, Portia in Merchant of Venice. Lillian went on to appear in numerous productions in London and round the

country (UK) such as *Dancing at Lughnasa*, in the Dukes Theatre, Lancaster. Lillian has appeared on *Crimewatch* for the BBC and many films, including *Conspiracy of Silence* which won a few awards, numerous short films and even animation. Lillian is also a voice over artist in Dublin, London and recently Brisbane. Since joining QSE Lillian has appeared in *Shakespeare's Shorts* and as Madame Pernell in *Tartuffe*.



Meg Bennett

Meg is a Brisbane based artist who began her infatuation with theatre and Shakespeare at a young age. After completing an unusual apprenticeship in 2020, 2024 marks her fourth year as a member of the Core Ensemble. Meg completed a Bachelor of New Media Arts (Performance) at James Cook University.

Her theatre credits include *Tartuffe* (QSE), *The Penelopiad* (QSE), *5 Women Wearing the Same Dress*, *Macbeth* (QSE), *The Rover* (QSE), *Romeo & Juliet* (QSE), *Two Noble Kinsmen* (Skimble Skamble Fools), *Pulp, Henry IV Part 1, Nunsense*,

Twelfth Night, As You Like It and Hamlet. She has also participated in workshops with the touring cast of Cats and DanceNorth.



Mikala Crawley

Mikala has been with QSE since 2021 where she completed the Apprenticeship program. She then went on to become a portfolio manger for Marketing/Events starting in 2022, in 2023 completed the new Advanced Apprenticeship program, and in 2024 joined the Core Ensemble.

Mikala has performed some of Shakespeare's works including *The Tempest* (2016), *As You Like It* (2018) and *Henry IV Part 1* (2019) with New Farm Nash Theatre, *As You Like It* (2021) with Thunderbear Productions, *Much Ado About Nothing* (2022) with St. Luke's Theatre Society and *Macbeth* (2022) with QSE.

She also directed/produced a staged reading of *The Two Noble Kinsmen* for the 2022 Anywhere Theatre Festival.

Mikala's other theatre credits include *Medea* (2018) with Underground Productions and UQ's Classics and Ancient History Society, *Game of Tiaras* (2018) with Re-Act Theatre Group, (Strathclyde University's theatre society in Glasgow), *The Penelopiad* (2023) and *Tartuffe* (2024) with QSE.



Rebecca Murphy

Rebecca is a Meanjin-based director, facilitator, and actor. A longtime Core Ensemble member, she is also QSE's General Manager. Her directing credits include *Tartuffe, The Penelopiad* (Matilda Award nomination for Best Ensemble), *The Rover, Henry IV Part I, Rosencrantz & Guildenstern Are Dead, Shakespeare's Shorts,* and *Bogga*.

As a performer with QSE her credits include Lady Macbeth (Macbeth and Macbeth In The Dark), Nurse (Romeo & Juliet), Paulina (The Winter's Tale), Mary (Mary Stuart), Tamora (Titus), Ariel (The Tempest), Helena (A Midsummer Night's

Dream), and Julia (The Two Gentlemen of Verona). Other credits include Tales of Rain, Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf, LovePuke, Romeo and Juliet, and A Midsummer Night's Dream.

QSE facilitating work includes Speaking Shakespeare in Your Own Voice, Young Actor's Shakespeare Intensive, Raising Voices, and Shakespeare Prison Project. She has also taught at the University of Queensland, NIDA Open, Brisbane Drama Studio, Tropical Arts, Underground Productions, and ABCN.



Scott Mair

Scott is a Brisbane based actor, who has always had a deep love and passion for performing. After completing high school, Scott studied acting at the Australian Performing Arts Conservatory (APAC) graduating with a Bachelor of Screen and Stage. Since then, Scott has performed on stage in festivals such as the Anywhere Festival and the Brisbane Fringe Festival, and appeared in short films that became award winners in international film festivals, even snagging an award or two for himself. In 2024 Scott joined The Queensland Shakespeare Ensemble as an apprentice, earlier this year he appeared as Valere in *Tartuffe*.



Riley Anderson

Riley was a 2023 QSE Apprentice. He also performed with QSE in *The Penelopiad* in 2023. Prior to this his training included a Bachelor of Fine Arts (Drama) at QUT, Backbone Youth Ensemble (2018), and Queensland Theatre Youth Ensemble (2015 – 2016).



Rob Pensalfini

Rob was one of QSE's founders and has been Artistic Director since 2001. His directing credits for QSE include Twelfth Night, A Midsummer Night's Dream, Hamlet, The Blood Votes, and Romeo & Juliet. His acting roles including Coriolanus, Benedick, Sir Toby Belch, Richard III, Shylock (2011), Prospero, Titus Andronicus, Leontes, Falstaff, Macbeth, and Tartuffe. Rob also composes and plays music for many of QSE's productions.

Rob directed QSE's Shakespeare Prison Project from 2006 to 2019, and has directed eight inmate productions, and

published Prison Shakespeare: for these deep shames and great indignities in 2016 (Palgrave). Rob is also Associate Professor in Linguistics and Drama at the University of Queensland. He has published numerous books and articles on aboriginal languages, and half a dozen articles on theatre and actor training. He is one of only nine people in Australia certified by Kristin Linklater to teach the world-renowned Linklater voice method and now trains other teachers. He has performed and/or taught professionally with Pilgrim Theatre (USA), Shakespeare & Company (USA), Zen Zen Zo, Power of Will, and the Queensland Theatre Company. Rob was inducted as an Arts Queensland Culture Champion in 2013.

Paris Lindner






